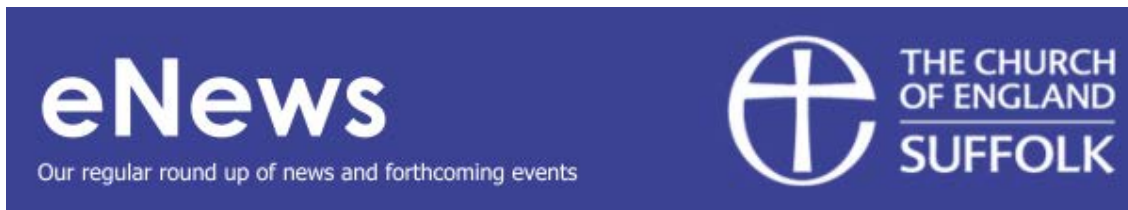

Walk the Way of the Cross with the Blyth Valley Churches this Easter!

Delight as church receives funding for urgent repairs



St Mary and St Lawrence Church, Great Bricett, has received a grant from the Valencia Communities Fund through the Landfill Communities Fund, for urgent repairs to its internal wall rendering. The grant of £30,620 will enable its replacement with lime-based render so helping to secure the future life of this important heritage building. The work also includes re-decoration throughout which will transform the internal appearance to create a much more attractive space for visitors and church users alike. Arland Shawe-Taylor, Churchwarden, said: *"We're delighted that we have received this support thanks to Valencia Communities Fund. The opportunity to eliminate the risk to the building from this unsightly cement render and to redecorate throughout will transform the interior space for our visitors and worshippers. We are also grateful for the grant support of £3,000 from Suffolk Historic Churches Trust towards this project"*.

Edmund Harris, Diocesan DAC Secretary said *" I am so pleased for Arland and his team who have worked really hard with dedication to complete this final stage in a long project to get the church off Historic England's Heritage 'at risk' register, which happened in 2022 - well deserved"*.

The Landfill Communities Fund began life as the Landfill Tax Credits Scheme in 1996 as a way of improving community facilities for those living in the vicinity of a landfill site. It allows landfill operators to donate a percentage of their tax liability to an environmental body. In the last 26 years, more than £1.5billion has been spent on qualifying community, environmental and heritage projects all over the UK. 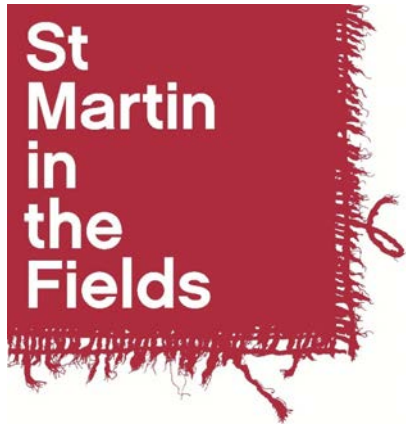
