Men and women are continuing to come forward in record numbers to serve communities as Church of England clergy right across Suffolk. A total of 23 were ordained as priests and deacons during last weekend, compared with ten during 2015.

On Saturday 1 July, Bishop Martin and Bishop Mike, ordained the newest 13 priests and ten deacons. Their backgrounds include previous careers in midwifery, neuroscience and working in a charity with disadvantaged families.

Matthew, Triangle and All Saints; Katherine Wilson, who will serve the Benefice of Wilford Peninsula and Lightwave Pioneer at The Place by the Water.

Bishop Martin is delighted to welcome so many new clergy and said: "We have a very active recruitment programme and we are seeing the fruits of investing in these people's futures and the future of the churches in Suffolk. The increased number of people wanting to become priests and deacons is a sign of the spiritual health of the Church, and of individual congregations."

We welcomed Principal Amon from Kagera, Tanzania at our Ordination services. This was a particularly relevant time to visit as Amon is Principal of the Kagera Christian Theological College (KCTC) which trains women and men for various forms of Christian leadership, both lay and ordained. He was very interested to meet with the ordinands and some of those involved in their training. Amon is staying with Chris and Anji Dawkins, our Diocesan Kagera Link Co-ordinators, for two weeks and so far he has attended Diocesan Synod, and visited the diocesan office, parish churches, the University of Suffolk, and Westcott House and Ridley Hall theological colleges in Cambridge, as well as other colleges in London and Oxford. Amon is visiting us to strengthen

the relationship between our two dioceses so that we can learn from each other.

Amon said "I am so grateful for the support that St Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocese gives to the KCTC enabling us to develop our programmes. There is so much we can learn from each other, our infrastructure and environment may be different but we do the same things, in similar ways. While visiting your parishes I have noticed the informality - services led by leaders without robes for example and everyone coming up to the altar. In our churches our buildings are smaller and we have more formality. Despite our challenges people love coming together in church, it is so joyful and energised, with people participating in spontaneous singing and dancing in the aisles".

Amon is looking forward to welcoming Bishop Martin and his wife Jutta, along with four others who are travelling to Kagera later in July.
