## **News from the Diocese**

I hope that this newsletter finds you well. We aim to provide news and information and to signpost you to training and resources which you will find helpful.

I am very conscious of the many challenges facing schools, from attendance to special educational needs to parental complaints. Our various online forums are a useful way of connecting with others so that we can share experiences and good practice. Please see our training programme for details of all our training. We are looking forward to our 'Big Sing' at the Cathedral on Tuesday 26 March. This event, organised in partnership with Christian Aid, will bring together pupils to sing and share examples of how schools are learning about global justice and taking action.

On a wider scale, it was good to attend the national Church of England education conference held in London on 1 February with a group from our diocese and many school and diocesan leaders from across the country. A range of speakers included the Archbishop of Canterbury, Laura McInerny, founder of Teacher Tapp and Krish Kandiah, author and broadcaster. Justin Welby described the Difference course which is a powerful free five session course designed to help pupils to navigate disagreement well.

We also heard about the Church of England's Flourish programme, as mentioned in our October newsletter. A national pilot will seek to develop worshipping communities in schools. This might involve developing chaplaincy, music and worship or prayer spaces. We are looking at developing a few pilots with schools and churches locally.

Krish, who leads the Sanctuary Foundation, spoke about the No Place like Home art and poetry competition. This competition for 7-18 year olds is aimed at encouraging children to relate to those who are displaced from home through original art or poetry.

As we seek to educate our pupils for wisdom, may I offer this prayer, adapted from the Church of England's Vision for Education:
