Church events tackle rural isolation and food poverty



A church project at St Mary's Church, Hadleigh aims to cut rural isolation and help alleviate food poverty, it has become so popular that up to 100 parents and children attend events.

Pop-Up events were started to promote a community spirit for those struggling in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. They also became a warm space for residents

and villagers finding it difficult to pay for soaring energy costs or have a hot meal. The majority of attendees come from Hadleigh, however some people travel to the town and events are also supported by Ukrainians and military families. Events have included weekly free meals, children's activities, crafts and a Christmas party. Financial support comes from church members, Hadleigh Town Council, charities and a local business. Food was supplied by Morrisons in the first few months. One attendee, Zoe, who brings along her two young children said: "We really appreciate the warm welcome, food and a safe place to chat and enjoy ourselves. The following is a statement from the archdeacons on this year's Articles, which focus on questions about your church's ministry with children under five years of age and their families.

Our ministry with children under five and their families is vital. Statistics show that 62% of people come to faith in Jesus before the age of 14 and a highly significant 38% before the age of 4*. How we minister to these families in our communities really matters. Often, our ministry with the under-fives can be the crucial first step on a child's (and indeed their family's) journey to faith. We are conducting this research to better understand what is already happening with the under-fives in our diocese and how we can use this as a foundation for growth. We want to share learning and best practice and learn how we can help you develop this area of your ministry. The data we collect will help us to know what support and advice and resources you would value and start to develop these.
