Restoration project protects the future of church bells for another century



The bells in St Peter and St Mary's Church, Stowmarket are finally back in the tower and ringing for service! The bells and frame underwent a major restoration project and were also augmented from eight to 10 bells in a project hampered by the Covid pandemic, which saw a three-year gap between the bells leaving and then returning. However the bells

rung out last Sunday (Sunday 25 February) at a dedication service attended by Bishop Mike Harrison. Bishop Mike said: "Church bells are a rich part of England's social landscape - ringing out to mark celebrations such as weddings or coronations, sounding dolefully for funerals or national mourning, and more ordinarily simply calling people to worship on a Sunday morning and at other times. So it's a joy to bless the bells at Stowmarket church as they once again begin to sound out after work has been undertaken on them - and a joy too to welcome back that committed group of bellringers who ensure that we hear those bells at their tuneful best." Music, Mission and Young People

Music is often a key factor in attracting people to church, and involvement in church music activities can provide an important opportunity to introduce young people to the Christian faith. The Diocese has launched a new project aimed at helping churches to use music as a transformative missional tool to encourage young people to grow in faith. This is being headed up by Richard Hubbard as Project Director, with Andrew Gosden as Project Manager. Richard and Andrew are keen to speak to churches or benefices that have a desire to develop music activities that involve young people. Examples might include:

- A youth choir
- A church choir with choristers
- A music group
- A choir run in partnership with a local C of E school

A key aspect of this project is that all such music activities should include a pathway for exploring and growing in Christian faith. The project plans to set up a network that will provide mutual encouragement and support, with music and faith development resources. Later in the year it is planned to submit a bid to the Strategic Mission and Ministry Board for longer-term funding that will enable local projects to be developed and sustained. 
