

Bishop Martin helps launch the 2024 Big Farmland Bird Count



This year Bishop Martin is the Suffolk Show President-Elect, and last week he was a guest at Lodge Farm, Westhorpe, near Stowmarket. The Barker family, who run the farm, launched this year's Big Farmland Bird Count. The first such counting of wild birds was held at the farm in 2014.

Now an annual event, the aim is for thousands of farmers and land managers across the UK to spend 30 minutes in the first two weeks of February to observe the wild birds that flock to their land. Last year more than 19,000 birds from 100 different species were spotted at 93 counts in Suffolk.

The event is organised by the Game and Wildlife Conservation Trust (GWCT) and sponsored by the National Farmers' Union (NFU). Bishop Martin said: "I started as Bishop here back in 2015 and ever since then I have been keen to support all the good work that our farmers do in our county, including the ways in which they care for our precious natural environment. Patrick Barker's experience and knowledge shone through as I learnt more about birds, winter feeding, habitat improvement and even about moths. I came away seeing once again that a farmer's day is never finished – and that in Suffolk we owe so much to our farmers who strive on our behalf to put food on our table and are the custodians of the countryside." Top-up shop tackles challenges faced by rural communities

The Revd Mandy Reynolds is a team vicar in the Wilford Peninsula Benefice, which includes the churches of St Felix and St Gregory in Rendlesham. Over the last five years, St Felix Church has grown into a thriving community hub, offering a Top-up shop and community café, which run every Tuesday. Mandy said people living in rural areas face different challenges to those living in towns and cities and require community resources to match those needs. "Social isolation is a big challenge faced by people in rural communities," she said. "In fact, many people come to the Top-up shop for the social aspect as well as to top-up their shopping. The social aspect has been so important – we hope this enables people to come along who wouldn't otherwise." The Top-up shop is supported by the BASIC Life charity, which supplies food for the project. Lots of people attend the shop including pensioners Brian and Jean, who have been coming to the Top-up shop since it opened. Brian said: "We are not regular church-goers but we come here because it's friendly and welcoming. We feel like we are part of the family." Read the full story here.

Watch and Pray Lent Resources



The Church of England's Lent theme for 2024 is Watch and Pray: Wisdom and hope for Lent and life. On the night he was betrayed, Jesus kneels in darkness in the

Garden of Gethsemane. Though he pleads with his disciples, "Stay here with me ... Watch and pray," they all fall asleep, leaving him alone in his hour of deepest suffering. This Lent, we are all encouraged to draw on the wisdom of Black Spirituality, particularly the practice of "tarrying" (waiting) as a community to draw closer to Jesus and to each other. Combining exuberant singing, fervent prayer and quiet lament, such services typically take place at night and last somewhat longer than the "one hour" Jesus asked of those first followers.
