Dear all,

It was good to be with several hundred others in Methodist Central Hall in Westminster recently for the third annual conference by the Church of England Foundation for Educational Leadership. A number of church school heads from this diocese attended, along with many others from around the country. Three keynote speakers, the Right Revd Sarah Mullally, Bishop of London, the Revd Rose Hudson-Wilkin, Chaplain to the House of Commons and Damian Hinds, Secretary of State for Education each spoke on the conference theme of Rethinking Resilience. Bishop Sarah spoke of the need to be confident in who we are, drawing our sense of self from God and His love. Rose inspired us with the life of Nelson Mandela to have a belief in a vision which sustains us in the lean years. Damian Hinds spoke of the importance of character education, to be developed in five ways: sport, creativity, performing, volunteering and membership and the world of work.

Increases in Teachers' Pensions employers' contributions

As you may be aware, there are plans to increase the employer's contribution to 23.6% from 1 September 2019 (currently 16.48%). Please see below two links, one to the consultation document produced by the Department of Education (DfE) and the second, a link to the consultation survey. The DfE plans to fund the increase but is seeking views. Funding isn't confirmed beyond 31 March 2020 and there are no details yet as to their proposed calculation method for awarding it to schools.

If this is something you feel strongly about, please take part in the consultation by 12 February but note that it is not asking whether the increase should be made or not, rather what the impact will be.


