Senior church leaders call for a month of prayer for the nation ahead of second lockdown

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York and a number of senior church leaders are inviting Christians across the nation to participate in the month of prayer – launching today – as a second lockdown in England comes into force.

Throughout the month, Christians will be encouraged to pray daily for a specific area of national concern, wherever they are, culminating into a collective moment of prayer at 6.00pm each evening, with cathedrals and churches across the country invited to ring a bell at this time. You are invited to follow a simple seven-day prayer cycle, praying for a specific area each day including the NHS and frontline workers, the bereaved, and those struggling with physical and mental ill-health, and for children and young people.

Remembrance Sunday online services 8 November 2020

At 10.00am St Edmundsbury Cathedral is holding a live streamed Remembrance Sunday concluding with an Act of Remembrance at 11.00am. You will be able to view this service on their Facebook page here.

Radio Suffolk is live streaming a Remembrance service from Christchurch Park in Ipswich at 10.45am with the service starting at 10.55am, hosted by Kevin Burch and available on their Facebook page here.

Bishop Martin, the Revd Mark Lowther, the Revd Richard Stretch, Archdeacon Rhiannon King and the Revd Simon Harvey will all be featured in Radio Suffolk's morning faith show on Sunday along with an 8.00am Remembrance Sunday church service led by Anglican Bishop to the Forces, the Rt Revd Tim Thornton.

Nationally there will be a service led by military chaplains at which tributes will be paid to all those who have served and continue to serve in the Armed Forces. Doorstep Remembrance - Because of Covid-19, there are requirements this year that attendance at publicly organised Acts of Remembrance is kept to a minimum. To enable community Remembrance in Suffolk, we encourage as many as possible to observe Remembrance on your doorstep with a two minutes silence at 11 o'clock on Remembrance Sunday, 8 November.
