Soap for Christmas

Attractively-packaged soap may be a typical Christmas present for loved ones close to home, but Richard Stainer, our World Development Adviser, is urging you to save lives this Christmas by helping to provide soap for some of the world's most vulnerable families.

Richard and his wife Christine travelled from their home to rural Ethiopia with Christian Aid in October 2019 to see projects helping communities access water and adapt to the climate crisis which is pushing families into extreme poverty. They saw how water pumps in rural communities were transforming the lives and health of villagers. But just months after their return coronavirus became yet another threat and this year locust swarms also destroyed precious food sources in Ethiopia.

In remote communities Christian Aid is helping women use the drought-resistant aloe vera plant to make soap to not only protect their families' health but also to sell for a source of vital income. Richard and Christine are now urging people to consider buying a £15 Charity Gift from Christian Aid to train a woman in soap-making or £30 to provide clean water. In many of our rural villages our church buildings and our church life stand in the centre



and at the heart of our communities. This year in Stanton the church and community have really worked together...which has been wonderful. There has been a huge and generous response to support the food bank with many many donations being left in the church porch. The Parish Council put up the Christmas Tree in the churchyard early this year and we as a church thought it would be lovely to have a life size Nativity Scene in the churchyard to bring a smile to people's faces and help to focus on the true meaning of Christmas. Having discussed the idea with a few folk in the village, a couple of them got together and ran with the idea. Wood was donated,

someone drew out the figures, which were then cut out. The figures were painted and varnished, and last Sunday afternoon with the help of the churchwarden, the Rector and people from the village we erected our Nativity scene.

We have invited the village to decorate the low branches of the trees in the churchyard with stars... and new stars are now appearing daily. Next Saturday afternoon, following on from our Carol Service we intend to go out into the churchyard and sing carols around the Nativity scene. It will be wonderful to have the Nativity scene at the centre not only of our Carol singing but also at the heart and centre of our community this Christmas. Census 2021

Sunday 21 March 2021

The diocese has been approached by the Census Engagement Managers for Suffolk and East Cambridgeshire to ask for your help in promoting the Census to those members of our community who may need extra support to complete it.

In particular they are looking for local support for the over 80's, low income households, people over 65 with low digital skills and people whose first language is not English, to ensure that they fulfil their legal requirement to complete the Census questionnaire.

This provides an excellent opportunity to build upon our presence in every community and the widespread response that so many churches and parishes have made during the COVID-19 pandemic to those most vulnerable, often alongside other county counterparts. The Church in East Cambridgeshire has already begun to put plans in place for communicating information via parish newsletters and offering their churches and buildings as venues for those needing help to complete the forms via drop-in events and cafés

Please could you discuss amongst your Chapter whether there was a similar offer that could be made in your deanery so that the Church can be at the heart of the response in Suffolk also.
