Message from Bishop Martin

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I want once again to thank you for all you are carrying through this time, practically, emotionally and spiritually, and assure you of my continuing support and prayers. I realise that for many of us we are entering this next stage with much less energy than we did back in March, and perhaps more apprehension given the virulence of the current virus variant.

We are grateful that the Government has not prohibited public worship. This reflects the Government's data that apparently there have been only 47 cases of Covid-19 linked to places of worship through the whole pandemic and across some 30,000 individual places of worship. This has been due, of course, to the incredible diligence and care with which protocols have been followed. Now with this new variant, we must make doubly sure we maintain all proper procedures both during acts of worship and in arrangements for arriving at and leaving services

I do recognise that for some, clergy, wardens and PCCs, holding physical services may not feel safe. Key personnel may feel particularly vulnerable, and some congregations may not wish to risk gathering physically. The decision to hold physical services must be a local decision, of incumbent and PCC. I have decided to grant a blanket suspension of the obligations to hold a service of Holy Communion in at least one church in each benefice on all Sundays and principal Feast Days, for the duration of the national lockdown.

Of course, if physical gatherings are suspended, then provision needs to be made or continued online and by other means that you have devised during this time so that the spiritual life of the community is sustained. And many of those who do continue with physical worship will also be continuing with online provision.

I want to stress that no one who feels vulnerable, clergy or laity, should have pressure placed on them to contribute to physical acts of worship. We must recognise our calling to make decisions 'with all humility, and gentleness with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (Ephesians 4.2-3). Whatever decision each church makes, we will all need to focus our energy on continuing the mission and work of the Church in our communities, who will need us now more than ever.

This is a traditional English celebration usually held on the Sunday after Epiphany, between 7 January and 13 January. In days gone by this would have been the beginning of the agricultural year and falls just before the ploughmen. St Edmundsbury Cathedral and parishes have previously celebrated this festival by bringing a plough into church grounds with prayers for the blessing of the land. Although the nature of farming has changed over the centuries, Plough Sunday is seen as a way of generally honouring farming and the work of farmers. Heritage Fund - Culture Recovery Grants Round Two - apply by 26 January

A second round of the Culture Recovery Fund will be open for applications from 7 January and will close on 26 January. The aim of this round is to support heritage organisations to resume business activity and welcome back visitors and customers. The funding will help recipients to build up their operations and begin a programme of heritage activity in April - June 2021. £36 million of this funding will be allocated to heritage organisations and businesses, administered by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, in partnership with Historic England.
