18 Thurs	In Kagera, beauty is seen in a successful harvest of maize or beans, not in a display of flowers.  Give 50p if you were given or gave flowers on Valentine's Day.  (Give 10p if you were given vegetables!)		
19 Fri	People in Kagera love to sing and dance to welcome visitors and for special events, traditionally using drums and whistles.  Give 10p for each musical instrument in your house.		
20 Sat	The pandemic has taught us to recognise and appreciate key workers. In Kagera there is no rubbish collection, no postal, supermarket or milk deliveries. There are no care homes.  Give thanks for all the key workers who have supported us here and give 10p for every one you know. If you are a key worker yourself, thank you – take a day off from giving.		
21 Sun	Lord, we ask for your blessing on all who offer loving care to their neighbours and who work to sustain and build community.

March 22 Mon World Water Day 23 Tues	Most houses in Kagera do not have a mains water supply. Christian Engineers in Development have partnered with CCMP to teach people how to build rainwater tanks. If you collect rainwater, give yourself a pat on the back. If not, give 50p to help build another tank in Kagera.  Many families in Kagera can't afford mains electricity – even if it is available.  Give £1 in thanks for your electricity supply.  Deduct 50p if you have solar panels.		
24 Wed	In Kagera clothes are washed in running water down at the river.  Give 10p for each time you used the washing machine last week.		
25 Thurs	Catering for large crowds at weddings and other events is every woman's work in Kagera. Huge cauldrons sit over charcoal or wood fires and delicious food is served from large buckets.  Give 5p for every saucepan in your house – large or small.		
26 Fri	When rains come in Kagera they can be torrential, washing away the crops. Grass roofs offer little protection from torrential rains. Give 20p for every umbrella in your home.		
27 Sat	Don't forget to put your clocks forward tonight! In Tanzania, time is usually counted from sunrise at 6am, so our 7am is their 1. What time would your church service tomorrow be in Tanzanian time?  Give 10p for every clock or watch you have to alter tonight.

3 Wed World Wildlife Day	During the Rwandan genocide in 1994, over a million refugees fled over the border into Kagera. The countryside was devastated and much of the wildlife disappeared. Now native species are being reintroduced into the area.  Give 10p for each kind of wild animal you have seen recently.		
4 Thurs World Book Day	Last year St Edmundsbury Cathedral donated over 200 books to the library at KCTC.  Give 50p for every book you buy this month, and 10p for every book you read.		
5 Fri World day of prayer	`As o'er each continent and island The dawn leads on another day;		
6 Sat	Illiteracy levels are high in villages in Kagera.  Give 1p for every year of your life since you learned to read.

March 8 Mon International Women's Day	Behind every thriving church in Kagera there's a powerful Mothers' Union branch. More than a fifth of the worldwide membership of the MU is in Tanzania. Give 10p if there's a MU branch in your church. Give 20p if there isn't.		
9 Tues	Dr Christian Ruzige is studying surgery in order to become a specialist at the Diocesan hospital in Murgwanza.  Pray for him, and give 50p for every further education course you've completed.		
Wed Wed	In Kagera, malaria and other diseases are endemic. The simplest malaria medication costs £3 for children, £4 for adults, and most struggle to find enough money.  Could you pay for malaria medication for someone today?		
11 Thurs	At the hospital in Murgwanza sometimes they have to wash bedding by hand because it is cheaper than using the electric washing machines.  Give 50p if you have a washing machine and can afford to use it.		
12 Fri	There are no GP surgeries in Kagera, but at Murgwanza hospital there are four doctors to treat outpatients as well as inpatients. Give 10p for every doctor at your surgery.		
13 Sat	It costs 5,000 shillings to see a clinician at Murgwanza hospital, 10,000 for a doctor. That's £1.50 or £3 – more than a day's income for most.  Can you pray for someone who is being treated in Murgwanza today and pay for their consultation?

16 Tues	Pastor Phocas and his team have done great work refurbishing the facilities at KCTC — they've bought new mosquito nets and mattresses, improved the kitchen, and dug a new toilet.  Give 50p for every home improvement you've made in the past year.
