Featured on BBC News online, you may have heard about the bring and share scheme and how it has has given away almost £750,000 in baby and children's clothes and equipment since it was launched just three years ago.

The Revd Andrew Dotchin and his army of volunteers set up the Pushchair Pitstop at St Edmund's Church in

Felixstowe just before lockdown in 2020 to help families through difficult times. Families are invited to donate unwanted baby and children's clothing when they attend - as well as items such as buggies, highchairs, bottles, toys and bikes - and to take any items they need themselves.

Andrew said: "We started the Pushchair Pitstop just before lockdown once a month so parents can swap and share their children's clothing... our vision was to create our own church giveaway shop and since lockdown ended the pitstop has just got busier and busier. I think we have given away almost £750,000 of kit over the last three years."


Thank you from Mothers' Union


