Christmas music and a Christmas card template are just two of the free items available on the **Resource Hub** within A Church Near You. This year's Christmas video tells the story of a woman's life supported by the local church. It begins with her starring role in the village nativity play to childhood and teenage years; joining church youth groups; later getting married; parenthood and then facing bereavement. The message is that wherever you are on life's journey, you're invited to church this Christmas.
