# **News from the Diocese**

Dear colleagues,

As I write, we are nearing the end of term after another extraordinary year. Whilst lots of end of term activities are taking place, we are also looking ahead to September. In line with other restrictions being lifted, from 19 July we will see the end of bubbles, the wearing of face coverings, and schools being responsible for contact tracing. Singing and the playing of brass and wind instruments will be allowed. Only those who have tested positive will be required to self isolate, not those who have been in contact. Let us hope for a more stable and less disrupted new school year. In the meantime, I hope that this newsletter provides you with some useful resources.

It was very good to see a number of Headteachers and senior leaders attend our annual wellbeing session recently. Suffolk Mind again led a very useful session on identifying and managing stress. Wendy Kelway, formerly Headteacher at Capel St Mary CEVCP also outlined a pilot coaching offer, of 12 sessions lasting 1.5-2 hours each (either face to face or virtual) over a year, costing £500. If any Headteacher or teacher is interested to find out more, they should contact wkelway@gmail.com. The Revd Canon Michael Robinson, Bishops' Chaplain also led a reflection, using the centuries old examen which I commend to you.

Meanwhile we continue to address some of the major issues of our time. Some schools have found it helpful to use the Responding to racism toolkit which we circulated last summer, based on Coventry diocese's work. If you have not already done this, you may like to do so. Auditing what we currently do has led some schools to review their library books and to add to these with a more diverse set of books. We are working with BAMEed, a network with some helpful resources for schools- Headteachers are invited to attend a session led by Allana Gay, co-founder of BAMEed and a Headteacher of a north London primary school on 14 October. Allana will focus on "How would you know that a school cherished and celebrated diversity and inclusion? What might you see, what might children and adults say about their experience?"






The football frenzy began with a Match of the Day themed warm up session, followed by a range of football themed learning activities and culminated in the Big Penalty Shoot Out!
