News from the Diocese

I hope that this newsletter finds you well. We aim to provide news and information, to share good news stories from schools and to signpost you to training and resources which you may find helpful. We are looking forward to our Big Sing at the cathedral on Tuesday 1 April, when over 500 children from 15 schools will be taking part. Our theme is Easter hope, appropriately in this season of Lent as we look forward to Easter.

We are always seeking to develop our support for schools. Here are a few updates.

We encourage schools to help children develop a deep understanding of issues of global justice, to use **Christian Aid's Global Neighbours Scheme** and to apply for one of their awards. Congratulations to **Sir Robert Hitcham's CEVAP, Framlingham** which has become the first school in the diocese to gain a Bronze Award.

The Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich has become one of the first in the country to partner with Christian Aid as an official Global Neighbours Partner Diocese. This formalises the already close working relationship between the diocese and Christian Aid. Global Neighbours is an accreditation scheme developed by Christian Aid and the Church of England National Society for Education, awarding schools for outstanding global citizenship education. Tim Burdon, Global Neighbours Development Coordinator at Christian Aid, says: 'It is fantastic to be in partnership with the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. By working together in this way we will be able to enhance opportunities for children and young people across the diocese to become active global citizens and courageous advocates for justice'.

Lent Appeal 2025

The Emmanuel Project, produced by the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is a high quality resource which aids primary schools with their RE teaching. It is written by experienced teachers and uses a wealth of research to enable strong RE learning for the classroom. In total, there are 51 units available to schools: including units focused on Buddhism, Christianity, Hindu Dharma, Humanism, Islam, Judaism and Sikhi. Each half termly unit has a key question and a key concept and uses the enquiry cycle to help children explore this key concept.

Conference

Our annual church school leaders' conference will take place at Ip-City in Ipswich on **Thursday 13 November 2025**.



Collective Worship Rachel Cutts has written new plans which focus on the Fruit of the Spirit, which are available here.

From July 2025, all of the Emmanuel Project resources will be available online via a subscription model. Each school will receive their own log in, which they are free to share with staff in their school setting. Links and accompanying resources will be checked termly by the Diocesan Education Team. Over a three year cycle, each individual unit will receive a full update so that they are in line with the latest research: starting this year, the Early Years units will be rewritten. We strongly believe that the Emmanuel Project will continue to be the go-to resource for RE teachers and urge schools to sign up to the annual subscription. This will be £50 per year, for which we plan to invoice primary schools in July.

Scripture Union - it's your move



This really brought the idea of Fairtrade and its impact to life. The children were so inspired that they're regularly showing school staff fairtrade items they've found at home or persuaded parents to buy over non-fairtrade.



Beech class have also started work towards a Fairtrade School award.

Congratulations to pupils at Sir Robert Hitcham CEVAP, Debenham who have been using the school's new postbox to post about a particular injustice that they feel strongly about and what they would like to do to help bring about change. Recently pupils have raised money for the fire department in Los Angeles fighting the wild fires and one pupil is researching the introduction of reader pens to help dyslexic pupils.



Congratulations to Sir Robert Hitcham's CEVAP, Framlingham, which has not only become the first school in the diocese to gain a Global Neighbour's Bronze Award, but has also taken part in Christian Aid's Creative for Climate Justice. This supports pupils to explore climate change as an issue of social justice and make artworks to showcase their ideas, and their hopes for a just and sustainable future.





Pupils created artwork and wrote letters to the local library and Business Association to ask about exhibiting their work. The library hosted a gallery of their artwork over two weekends with explanations of how the classes thought about what they wanted. The Business Association invited representatives from the School Council to a meeting to speak on this. One of the pieces of artwork was also sent to the Houses of Parliament for the exhibition there last November. An important lesson for pupils was knowing that their letters had an impact."




Archbishops' Young Leaders Award (AYLA) Free information sessions
