News from the Diocese

Dear colleagues,

This newsletter comes with news of upcoming events, training and resources which I hope you will find useful. I am very aware of how hard everyone in schools are working and hope that the May half-term will provide some welcome rest, now that restrictions are lifting.

It has been so good to be in schools this term. We are pleased to be offering SIAMS support visits, interviewing for headships and seeing children again. We are continuing to hold meetings and training sessions via Zoom for now and will keep this under review. Please see details of our termly Headteachers' forum and Chairs of governors' forum opposite. We are also holding wellbeing sessions for Headteachers, administrative staff and governors this term, as well as a new governor training session on monitoring (more below).

The Church of England has recently been approved as one of nine national providers of national professional qualifications for teachers. The DfE has reformed its whole suite of professional development and this is an exciting step. National training will be delivered by key local delivery partners and we hope that church schools will be able to access high quality training (further details are available here). The Church of England has already successfully run four cohorts of the CofE Professional Qualification for Headship and it was good to hear Darren Gates, Headteacher at St Matthew's CofE Primary in Ipswich present on 23 March, having successfully completed his CofEPQH.

Further changes to teacher training also come in from September 2021 with the introduction of the Early Career Framework, and a two year induction for Early Career Teachers replacing the current one year induction for Newly Qualified Teachers. For more please click here.

Also from September, the management and administration of SIAMS inspections, quality assurance of inspection practice and of reports (including critical reading) and inspector training will come from the new national team. Dioceses will no longer deal with any of the administrative aspects of SIAMS inspections but will retain responsibility for providing


