News from the Diocese

Dear Colleagues

It has been lovely to see pictures of various celebrations of the Coronation taking place in our schools this month. I know many of you have enjoyed creative ways of celebrating with the children and local community.

One of the most moving parts of the Coronation service for me was the presentation of the bible to King Charles with the words: "We present you with this Book, the most valuable thing that this world affords. Here is Wisdom; This is the royal Law; These are the lively Oracles of God." I love the idea of the most valuable thing that the world can give: the living word of God.

We are looking forward to our own celebration of church schools and to welcoming schools to our cathedral service on 19 June at 1.30pm. Our cathedral service theme is Seeking Wisdom, Knowledge and Truth. I hope that schools continue to seek inspiration from the Church of England's vision for education, with its four key elements: educating for wisdom, hope, community and dignity- <u>Vision for Education</u>.

There have been many calls for a review of how Ofsted works following the tragic death of Ruth Perry, Headteacher. As a Diocesan Board of Education, we very much recognise the pressure of the system on school leaders, but acknowledge, as do Headteachers, the need for accountability for standards and an independent inspection system. Overall Ofsted has been a force for good and most schools' experience of inspection is positive. As a team we are privileged to attend final Ofsted feedback meetings along with governors and a representative from the local authority (in the case of maintained schools). We are always happy to support Headteachers both before and after inspection and will continue to offer training for heads and governors. It will be interesting to see how the changes in the SIAMS framework from September work out as we move away from gradings to an overall judgement.

Given the pressures on Headteachers, may I commend our

National Professional Qualifications (NPQs)

The St Edmundsbury and Ipswich DMAT is offering the following CofE NPQs – Leading Teaching (NPQLT) and Senior Leader (NPQSL), whilst the Diocese of Norwich is offering Headship (NPQH), Leading Teacher Development (NPQLTD), Leading Behaviour and Culture (NPQLBC) as well as Early Headship Coaching Offer (EHCO), from Spring 2024.

The CofE NPQs are the only ones to offer coaching as part of the programme. For NPQLT and NPQSL the face-to-face days and the coaching are led by Heather Hann, Jane Trampnow and MAT Heads. At the moment, the costs are being funded by the DfE and there is a further £800 of funding available for schools with less than 150 pupils to pay for supply costs.
