News from the Diocese

Dear colleagues,

As we approach half term, this newsletter brings you news and information from across the diocese. After the success of the Big Sing at the cathedral in April (see below), we are very much looking forward to welcoming children, staff, governors and parents to our annual cathedral service on Monday 23 June at 1.30pm. The theme this year is community: living well together. This is one of the four aspects of the Church of England's vision for education. iSingPOP will be working with schools to teach them songs and we will all come together for a glorious celebration.

It was a joy to celebrate 150 years of education at Dennington CofE Primary School earlier this month (see below). Many schools took part in VE day celebrations.

We hope that SATs went smoothly last week and that GCSEs are going well for our secondary pupils.

I am delighted to let you know that following interviews for our new part-time post of Diocesan Schools Adviser, we have successfully appointed Victoria (Tor) Bush. Tor currently teaches at Barrow CEVCP School and will take up the post in September. Tor has been doing some work for us this year with a small group of church schools on spirituality. We look forward to welcoming Tor to the team.

I recently read Jonathan Haidt's book, The Anxious Generation, which makes a compelling case for a smartphone-free childhood. He describes how parents increasingly over-protect in the real world and massively under-protect in the virtual world by giving children a smartphone. He highlights a survey of young people which revealed how they wished that their parents had not given them a smartphone until they were older, and that they had limited screentime. A growing body of evidence is pointing to the risks to children's mental health and the need for strong school policies (see below for Children's Commissioners report).

Flourishing for All: Antibullying Guidance for Church of England Schools (updated April 2025)

In March 2025, new guidance on preventing and tackling race-based bullying was added as part of the CofE ongoing commitment to addressing all forms of bullying in Church schools. Further sections will continue to be developed to support schools in fostering environments where all pupils and staff can belong, achieve, and flourish.
