Working with Victoria Bush, the staff team explored what spiritual development could look like for children and chose a quote by Karl Jung about 'spiritual shoes' to support their strong Christian vision around 'letting your light shine' with a particular focus on meeting the needs of each individual child.

This analogy has led them to have a weekly 'spiritual shoes' Collective Worship session in which a member of the school or wider community, brings in a pair of shoes from a moment in their life. Using these as a springboard, the speaker is invited to talk about a moment in their life where they wore these shoes, and then children pick from a 'powerful questions' jar, to delve deeper into the meaning and impact of this moment on their unique journey.



This analogy has since developed further in their Harvest service, with the children focused on having empathy with those who might need to use the local Food Bank, filling a giant pair of shoes with food donations.

### Updated statutory guidance on the cost of school uniforms

The statutory guidance contains draft sections to support schools to adhere to the proposed limit on the number of branded items of school uniform and PE kit that schools can require. The government intends to make this a legal requirement from September 2026 through the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill. The draft statutory guidance will be updated on completion of the Bill's passage through Parliament. Schools will need to take the draft statutory guidance into account when planning uniform requirements for September 2026.

Schools are advised to begin reviewing their uniform policies; making any necessary adjustments; and engaging with suppliers as soon as possible on any changes, to ensure that
