#### **Activity 1: Telling the Easter story**




These 8 videos tell the story of Easter, starting with Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) through to His ascension back into heaven



## **Activity 2: Easter Artefacts**




- 3. Draw a picture to match the sentence you have been given.


