

Service - content ideas for Christian collective worship

Definition: Jesus said that he 'came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' He is an example of service followed by Christians today. The parable of the Good Samaritan shows we should serve those in need whoever they are. Such service is not offered to gain some advantage for ourselves. 'Going the extra mile' involves sacrifice, putting ourselves out for someone else's benefit. Serving God means serving others.		Key Bible Character - Jesus exemplified what it was to be a servant – the 'servant king' – Christians believe he was the greatest servant who ever lived.

How do we thanks those who serve us? Who do you serve in your life? What do you do to serve others? How can you be a willing servant at home? with your friends? 3	Through the roof	Luke 5:17-39 <u>watch</u>	The men loved their sick friend so much that they were willing to go through quite extreme measures to serve him and see him healed. The other people there may have found it outrageous, but Jesus knew exactly why he was lowered down.

6	Kind Dorcas/Tabitha	Acts 9 <u>video</u>	A woman 'full of good works' she provided coats and clothing for the poor and the widows.
7	The story of Esther	Esther 3-5 <u>watch</u>	Esther summoned her courage when she told the King about Haman's plan to kill all of the Jews, which would include herself. King Xerxes was furious at the prospect of losing his beloved and beautiful Esther and ordered Haman to be arrested. And so it was that Esther's name will be forever be remembered for her willingness to risk everything in the service of her people.

9	Elijah and the widow	1 Kings 17:7-16	It is easy for us to help when it doesn't cost us anything. It's a lot harder to help someone in need when you are not much better off than them. The story of Elijah and the widow teaches Christians to trust that God is going to help them make up the difference when they are called to help someone.
