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### **Spiritual Development Project Update**

It has been a busy Spring Term so far - we have now completed staff meetings at every school and begun developing analogies for helping our school communities to talk about 'spiritual development' in their setting. Barrow CEVAP are using the analogy of a river, Elveden that of shoes (linked to a quote by Carl Jung) and Barnham and St. Peter and St. Paul schools are exploring the language around a tree (roots, shoots and fruits). This has helped staff and senior leaders really identify what is unique and important to them and deepened their understanding of how, where and when spirituality is developing every day in their school. Next steps are creating roll-out plans for how to start using and sharing this language in school in a way that makes an impact.

#### **Emmanuel Project online!**

We are currently planning a new Emmanuel Project website, where all the plans, resources and supplementary materials will be available. We're aware that, sadly, some of the links to websites no longer work, and some resources mentioned within the plans are no longer available. This shift to moving it all online will mean that it can all be checked and updated regularly by the Diocesan Education Team. In total, there are 51 units available to schools: with units focused on Buddhism, Christianity, Hindu Dharma, Humanism, Islam, Judaism and Sikhi. Over a 3-year cycle, each individual unit will receive a full update so that they are in line with the latest research, starting this year with the six early years units. More information will be sent to schools shortly - we are aiming to launch the website in **July 2025** so that it is in place for the new academic year.
