
Beccles is one of our beacon areas and has:

- Developing new projects with their Curate, the Revd Alix Taylor.











The Revd Ali Miller (Thingoe Deanery) to the Diocesan Secretary:

How many churches in the diocese are placing limitations on how their parish share contributions are being used, by withholding parish share, donating through the Ephesian Fund or similar third party, or through a special arrangement with their diocese, such that their contributions cannot be used to support all churches and clergy in the diocese?

Reply from Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary:

We currently have no parishes who are placing limitations on how their parish share contributions are being used, by withholding parish share, donating through the Ephesian Fund or another third party or through any other arrangement with us. The principle of supporting all parishes and clergy in the diocese is important and we hope that this will continue to be accepted across the Diocese as we all, together, support the work of serving each other and our communities across Suffolk.

The Revd Ali Miller (Thingoe Deanery) to the Diocesan Secretary:

How much money is affected by these arrangements?

Reply from Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary:

Given there are currently no such arrangements, the financial impact is £zero.



Sally Wainman, (Colneys Deanery) to the Diocesan Secretary:

Is the Diocese aware that the Houses of Parliament are themselves going to backtrack on upgrading to a heat pump system because the trial has shown that:

- a) heat pumps would be very, very expensive to install
- b) would be far more expensive to run than their current system
- c) won't produce enough heat to keep the place warm
- d) are incredibly noisy and distracting?

Reply from Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary:

Each situation is unique, however the DBF experience is that heat pumps are an effective technology for decarbonising heating, being far more efficient than boilers that rely on combustion and reducing the primary energy required for space heating. They are one of many technologies that can effectively decarbonise heating in our churches, and we continue to be committed in working towards net zero carbon.

Whilst single projects might not always prove successful where the potential risks of noise and electricity supply are too high, a quick search shows that 69 heat pumps have been installed across the Parliamentary estate since 2022, including 18 heat pumps installed in 2024.

Sally Wainman, (Colneys Deanery) to the Diocesan Secretary:

Given that many churches would be likely to experience the same drawbacks as they attempt to retrofit a heat pump system, should we not stay with the tried and tested boilers that have stood the test of time, and have engineers to service and repair them?

Reply from Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary:

- Heat pumps are just one of many alternatives to boilers that churches can use to heat their buildings. Just like any technology, a heat pump may not be the right solution in every case, but other technologies like pew heaters, infrared heaters, electric boilers, and direct electric heaters are all alternatives that are already being used by many churches in England.
- The successful implementation of heat pumps in many churches across the country and the large numbers installed around the world in a variety of different climates, means they are a tried, tested, and proven technology.
- The most tried and tested heating technology across the diocese is electric heating, with almost three quarters of our church buildings already being heated by electricity. The data we have also suggests these churches use less energy and spend less money on heating than churches that have boilers powered by oil and gas.
- The DBF will continue to work with all parishes that are currently using fossil fuels for heating, offering advice, support and access to the shared learning that is happening across the Eastern region.


