Vocation Spotlight: The Revd Linda Pepper on being a chaplain

I grew up in a context where there were few young people eager to follow Jesus, yet I believed whole-heartedly that I could not do anything else. When I went to Unit and found 70 other 18–21-year-olds meeting together in the Uni Social Space, I was thrilled and delighted and remember rushing to the phone box to tell Mam and Dad that I had found the very best thing to give my life to. And so began the journey that has brought me to the University and College Chaplaincy work I am engaged in today.

By 1999, and with two small boys, my passion for the student world resolved into working part-time with CYM, engaging with children and young people through schools' work, and



then beginning a discipleship training year for those who, pre- or post-Uni, wanted to grow in their understanding of faith and action. My boys grew up and the student world beckoned again, this time uniting my passion for people from other nations with my love for students as I became the International Student Chaplain at the University of Essex before accepting my current role as Lead Chaplain at University of Suffolk and Suffolk New College. Diocesan Board of Patronage Elections

The Diocesan Board of Patronage (DBP) is the patron (either sole patron or jointly with another or others) of some 30 benefices in the diocese. Where a vacancy occurs in one of those benefices, the Board plays an important role in the vital process of selecting a new incumbent (or, where presentation has been suspended for any reason, a priest in charge). Presently, there is a number of casual vacancies on the Board. The DBP needs three lay members and one ordained member for it to be fully constituted. Those elected will serve until the end of the current six-year term on 31 December 2024. The lay positions are open to anyone on a parish electoral roll. Candidates will need to be nominated and seconded by elected clergy/lay members respectively of the Bishop's Council. Under the relevant Measure, they are also the electorate for any byelection.

If you are interested in standing for election, please email <u>Gary Peverley</u>, Acting Diocesan Secretary, or <u>Charlotte Hodgson</u>, Governance Manager, who will send you a nomination form. Completed nomination forms must be returned by 12 noon on Thursday 7 September. If there is a contested election, it will be completed by Thursday 28 September.

Update on Renewal of LLM Licences and LLM PTOs

PTOs are renewable every three years based on age so there will continue to be a prompt if yours is due for renewal. For those who hold Licences, please note that as this is 2023 all LLM Licences have to be renewed for the Called Together Service on 24 September.

As this is a mammoth administrative task, it has become too overwhelming to continue with this system. We shall therefore be reverting to the triennial renewals by Archdeaconry. This will be a little awkward initially, but please bear with the extra repetition of paperwork! So, all licenses will be renewed this year then:

Sudbury Archdeaconry: Licences will be valid for one year with renewal in 2024 then again in 2027

Suffolk Archdeaconry: Licences will be valid for two years with renewal in 2025 then again in 2028

Ipswich Archdeaconry: Licences will be valid for three years with renewal in 2026 then again in 2029

Connect is a one-year course starting in September 2023, exploring child development, spirituality and formation, new approaches to Family Ministry and personal skills to enable participants to be visionary Family Ministry leaders within the parish and across the Diocese.
