#### **Follow the Star: Calm and Bright**



December can feel like chaos – lots of social events, services, Christmas presents to buy, never-ending to-do lists and the pressure to create the perfect Christmas. But in the midst of this chaos, our churches can offer an opportunity to find peace during this busy time. The Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas 2024, *Follow the Star: Calm and Bright*, draws on the world-famous carol, Silent Night: "Silent Night! Holy

Night! All is calm, all is bright..."

Throughout Advent, the focus is primarily on how to find **Calm** during this busy period, with reflections offering people a chance to pause during the busy season and tips on how to prepare for a calm Christmas. Then through Christmas, this moves to **Bright**, with a series of daily reflections from Christmas Day to the Eve of Epiphany (5 January) by Sammi Tooze, Discipleship Adviser for the Diocese of York.

It's that time of year when the temperatures are dropping and all of us are turning to our heating to keep us warm. Remember: if your church is heated by oil or gas you could start considering how you will replace your system now. Consider what you could replace it with, and how you will keep your church warm in the event of a heating breakdown. Replacement of a fossil fuel heating system, even a like-for-like replacement, now requires a faculty and is no longer a quick fix for any winter heating woes! A great place to begin is by running through the Church of England's <u>guidance on heating your church</u>.

Unfortunately, boilers do break down from time to time, so it's a good idea to have a plan of how you will keep people in your church warm if this does happen. There are many temporary heating options, ranging from hiring or purchasing free-standing infrared heaters and electric blowers, to temporary boiler hire which may be linked up to your existing heating system. The Church of England guidance document <a href="Temporary Heating">Temporary Heating</a> <a href="Options">Options</a> gives advice on what you should consider and a few examples of temporary heating options. Be prepared and help your church to avoid being left in the cold!

But it is the larger part of the Bible and has far more to say than the New Testament about things like the life cycle (birth, marriage, death), sickness and health, daily work, the environment, social justice, and so on. In other words, it relates to life as we know it on a day-by-day basis. Of course, there are some challenging bits which need also to be confronted in an honest manner, but they should not deflect us from the riches of what was, after all, Jesus' Bible. (Where did he get the first and great commandment ... and the second is like, namely this...?) In this short course, Hugh Williamson will try to open our eyes to some of this wealth by surveying in an engaging manner all the different types of material in the Old Testament, very much with an eye on how we can apply it in our own times in both church and society.
