Diocesan June Synod 2025

Diocesan Synod met in St Edmundsbury Cathedral on Saturday 7 June. The theme of this Synod was 'Well-being' and Archdeacon David gave the presidential speech:

The topic of 'Well-being' was continued by Archdeacon Rich and this included a time to reflect, and a discussion with the Revd Canon Sharron Coburn about ministry support, the Suffolk Missional Development Programme and the planned changes so that the Diocesan Dispute Advisory Service becomes a Mediation Service.

Archdeacon Sally and the Revd Kathy Wilson introduced a new Clergy Retreat voucher scheme to Synod, If you are a member of clergy and signed into Insight you can view more information and booking dates <u>here</u>.

Gary Peverley, Diocesan Secretary, discussed clergy housing and finally the Revd Peter Goodridge informed about clergy retirement benefits. The Synod members voted in support of the following motion:

"This Synod welcomes the Church of England press release dated 22 May 2025 to improve pensions, but urges General Synod members to support the Private Members' motion on pensions and clergy retirement benefits tabled by the Revd Canon James Blandford-Baker due to be put to General Synod in July 2025 and as outlined in Appendix 1 of Paper DS(25)P12.5".
