Government's VAT grant scheme: This scheme gives grants to refund the VAT on repairs or alterations over £1000 to a listed place of worship. The official name of the scheme is the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme. The scheme is currently set to run only until the end of March 2025. As you may know, the government is looking very carefully at expenditure in the run up to the late October budget. If you, or anyone you know, has used the grant scheme, and thinks it worth retaining, would you consider taking five minutes to send an email in its support? - by noon this Friday. Please send your email to The Rt Hon Lisa Nandy MP, Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport, (lisa.nandy.mp@parliament.uk). You can also copy your own MP (find their email address at here). Include in your email: the name of the scheme in the title, clearly ask for the scheme to be extended, if you have concrete experience of the scheme, briefly explain what your project is/was for, and why the VAT refund is/was important, also do say if your project was funded by gifts and donations.
