Vacancy in See

With Bishop Martin's retirement planned for the end of February 2025, a discernment process is underway to find the next Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. The process is being overseen by the Vacancy in See Committee, a statutory committee which has a permanent existence but only meets when there is a vacancy in the diocesan bishopric. See is from the Latin term for 'seat' and historically refers to the bishop's throne, i.e. centre of authority and jurisdiction.

The Vacancy in See Committee is in the process of producing a Statement of Needs, which outlines the strengths of the Diocese, the challenges facing it and the qualities the committee believes the new bishop will need. As part of this process they will be holding a public consultation meeting to hear your views on Wednesday 17 July from 7.00pm to 9.00pm. ***SAVE THE DATE* registration details will be available soon.**

Pray your part - general election 2024: The Church of England is launching a campaign known as #PrayYourPart – to promote prayer and participation in the life of our nation and communities, both as voters and as citizens. A series of daily thematic reflections written by bishops, drawn from the Bible and exploring major themes, will be covering the final three weeks up to polling day. They will be available as a booklet, in audio form for smart speakers, as free opt-in emails and through social media. St Edmundsbury Cathedral launches three gins: St Edmundsbury Cathedral have partnered with another Suffolk-based company to produce three Cathedral-inspired gins. The three gins they have made are:

- Abbey Gin is a London Dry Gin which reflects the classic surroundings of the Cathedral with orange notes and a signature gin profile.
- Edmund Rose is gin distilled with rose petals to create floral notes on the palate which reflect the Edmund Rose, a very special flower planted in 2005 in commemoration of the completion of St Edmundsbury Cathedral's new Millennium Tower and the visit of HRH, Charles, Prince of Wales and Camilla, Duchess of Cornwall.
- Pilgrims' Garden is a London Dry Gin distilled using botanicals, including lemon balm and chamomile, which would have been grown by the monks over 1,000 years ago.

All of these lovely gins are available from the Cathedral shop.



Recognising the Suffolk Women's Land Army: The Suffolk Women's Land Army Trust held a special fundraising event at Saxham Hall last week, supported by the Barrow Benefice. The trust aims to raise £100,000 to build a statue honouring those who joined the Women's Land Army and Women's Timber Corp in Suffolk. They also look to create an online roll of honour, so those who served are recognised for their efforts. The Revd Lynda Sebbage, Rector of the Barrow Benefice, said: "It was such a lovely event and very well attended. As soon as I heard their plan I knew we wanted to help, and it fit in perfectly with our aims of bringing the community together on important projects. Without the Women's Land Army turning over the land, taking over when the men
