#### **Prisons Week**

St Edmundsbury Cathedral will hold a special service at 10.30am on Sunday 15 October to mark Prisons Week. Prisons Week encourages communities to pray for, and raise awareness of, the needs of all those connected with prisons; prisoners and their families, many of whom come from disadvantaged and debilitating backgrounds, together with victims of offenders, prison staff, contractors, chaplains, and volunteers who work in an intense and often difficult atmosphere. Prisons Week has been running for almost 50 years. Led by Bishop Martin the service will include prayers for prisoners, victims and staff. A number of serving prisoners from HMP Hollesley Bay, Suffolk's open prison, will take part in and join the service. This year, the address will be given by the Anglican chaplain at HMP Highpoint, the Revd Mark Osbourne. After the service, there will be an opportunity for engagement - with prisoners, prison staff and others - with current issues in prisons, and discussion and reflection. Refreshments will be provided.


