70 Children learn about God's Love at Barham Church Holiday Club

In August the J-Team Holiday Club was held for the 36th year in Barham Church. Apart from one year's break for the Covid pandemic, this 3day event for primary school-aged children has run every year since 1987. The early J-Team attendees are now sending their own children and reminiscing on their own time at the holiday club as a youngster.

The benefice is hugely grateful to all those who organised and ran the J-Team holiday club this year and the additional people who turned up to help set up and clear up.

A total of 70 children aged between 5 and 11 attended, and were organised into three seperate age groups. The children came from all across the Claydon Benefice and beyond.

The Church, the hall, the newly constructed terrace and two large marquees in the Churchyard were all occupied and bustling with children enjoying the activities on offer. These included art and crafts, Bible stories and videos, singing, baking, treasure hunts, games and more, all based on the theme of *God's Love*.

Thanks to the generosity of a benefactor in the parish, every child and leader was able to enjoy a Magnum ice cream at the end of a mini-Olympics in the Churchyard on the Friday afternoon. The week ended with a "show and tell" celebration in Church to which the parents and family members arrived in large numbers, filling up the church.

The Church of England ensures that all those who preach in public with its authorisation are appropriately discerned, trained and supported with ongoing reviews. Clergy and Readers are trained at a high level to national standards to enable this ministry, and in addition, a bishop can give permission to preach for those who are under the authorisation of the Incumbent and have the support of the congregation via the PCC. If you have a commissioned role such as Elder or licensed ministry such as Evangelist, Pioneer, Children's & Families' Minister or Youth Minister you can gain authorisation to preach (up to six times a year) for three years.
