The Church of England has awarded £9 million to dioceses for repairs and specialist advice to parishes.

A total of £2.8 million has been allocated for 30 Church Buildings Support Officers across the country to give specialist advice on the management, conservation, repair and development of church buildings, including community use alongside worship. A further £6.2 million has been allocated across 41 dioceses for making grants of up to £12,000 for repairs to churches.

The grants come from Buildings for Mission, funded by the Church Commissioners and administered by the Archbishops' Council over the period 2023 to 2025. We are delighted that

our Diocese is one of the thirty that has been allocated funding for a Church Buildings Support Officer. This role is also funded in partnership with the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust.


Advent and Christmas Events
