Two new deacons have been ordained by the Church of England in Suffolk. They were ordained by Bishop Martin, at a service on 16 October in St Mary-le-Tower Church, Ipswich. The Revd Gregor Purdie will be a deacon at St Mary-le-Tower while the Revd Dr Antony Rich carries out deacon duties in the Sancroft benefice which covers Fressingfield, Mendham, Metfield, Stradbroke, Weybread, and Withersdale.

Bishop Martin said: "We are delighted to welcome them as deacons and guide them as they set out on a new stage of their journey in Christian life in Suffolk. These devoted clergy will be at the heart of their communities, guiding, supporting and inspiring people in every day life." Read more here.

Lay Elders Celebration

Last weekend saw the celebration of Lay Elder ministry at St Edmundsbury Cathedral with a service led by Bishop Martin. Lay Elders have been in existence in our Diocese since the late 1960s, they help either with pastoral care in their local congregation and community or lead worship and support the ministry team in their parish or benefice (and some do both!). Elders do amazing work and this service recognised the variety of the ministry that they do from visiting people in their homes or in hospital, following up baptisms and funerals, welcoming newcomers, supporting young families and elderly people, to working in schools.

"We're on a journey, together." said Bishop Martin. He recalled his pilgrimages around the county with Bishop Mike, and stressed how much easier it had been made by the numerous people who had assisted them on their journey, providing refreshment and encouragement and giving helpful directions. "This is your role in the Church," he said, "To help people as they journey through life, offering them direction and encouragement along the way." It was a fitting and thought-provoking message, both for us Lay Elders and for the musicians and choristers who enhanced our worship wonderfully and guided us, expertly, through a couple of unfamiliar hymns, to the very welcome tea and cake at the end. The service also combined the Diocesan Choral Festival with music from singers and choirs across the diocese, under the direction of Claudia Grinnell, the new Director of Music at St Edmundsbury Cathedral.

Give to Go Green



'Give To Go Green' is a national church match-funding campaign to help you double your locally GOGREEN raised donations. Funding is available for churches and church halls/rooms that want to carry out small to

medium-sized projects that will reduce their carbon footprint. Match funding is available up to £10,000, or 50% of your project costs, whichever is lower.

The first phase of Give to Go Green fundraising started on Sunday 1 September and will finish on Sunday 15 December 2024. A number of our churches took part including St Mary's Church in East Bergholt, who are raising funds to reduce the draughts coming from the two main church doors by fixing rails and hanging heavy, fire-retardant curtains in the porch and in the West End meeting room. St Peter & St Paul Church in Pettistree is also fundraising (see advert below!) to support their project to create a dry, warm and welcoming space for the use of the whole village.

We are now entering phase two of Give to Go Green, and the application pack and how to apply details for Phase Two will be released on 21 October 2024. The key dates are:
