## **Introducing 'Insight' - our new learning and resource platform**



Insight is the new learning and resource tool developed by the diocese. We are excited to invite you to visit insight.cofesuffolk and start exploring the content available.

The purpose of Insight is to make finding interesting courses, events and resources that are relevant to you, as easy as possible. Insight integrates into our website and you will notice some changes over the summer as we continue to connect our website with Insight. Benefits of Insight include:

- Easy to register and log in
- It is easy to use and everything is gathered in one place
- The search function makes finding content easy
- Once registered it will link to your role in the diocese, if you have one
- You can select areas of interest and Insight will recommend content relevant to you
- Your Learning Plan will track your recent activities, which courses you have attended and keeps your downloads together in your personal library for easy access.

A key element of Insight is that you can create your own Learning Plan by choosing topics you are interested in, as well as topics relevant to your role. Topics include leadership; children; families and young people; community engagement; creation care; everyday faith; leadership; living generously; new worshipping communities; parish support and vocations.

Create your own user account using the email address the Diocese already uses to contact you (for example, to send you eNews) - for those with a ministry of any sort, this will be stored in our Contact Management System (CMS) and typically also used for things like eNews. This will ensure your Insight account is linked to our Diocesan records and can identify relevant events and record training for you.

## **Building a Generous Church Conference**

others throughout the Diocese and access the information and resources on offer. Our three keynote speakers are leading on:

**Grant Forrest, CEO of the Parish Giving Scheme** 'Living Life Generously' As followers of Jesus, we are called to be generous. But what is generous discipleship? How can we cultivate a culture of generosity in our personal lives and our churches? In this session, we will explore what it means to be a generous disciple and a generous church and introduce the Parish Giving Scheme, which can help churches encourage regular giving. Join us as we explore how we can live a more generous life, as God has called us to.

Canon Jonathan de Bernhardt Wood, Director of Giving at the Church of England's National Giving Team 'Living Generously' Introducing a new discipleship resource on the different ways we can live generously, inspired by the story of Mary anointing Jesus' feet.

**Judi Newman, CEO of St Elizabeth's Hospice** 'Generosity in a Civil Society' Judi has been a charity fundraiser and philanthropy advisor for over 30 years. What defines a civil society? What does generosity look like in a civil society? There are strong themes of service, values and compassion but philanthropy is not a one-directional flow of wealth. Those involved in philanthropy or community fundraising are often surprised by the richness that they receive through their investment of time and a willingness to look afresh at complex challenges. We will look at Compassionate Communities and consider a society that is braver in having tender conversations and is willing to build a culture of generosity in all its forms. #### **Understanding Youth Leaders - Survey**

The national 30k Project has commissioned some research to understand how churches are preparing young leaders (volunteers who are under 18 years old) for outward-facing mission work, like a café or food bank. What safeguarding checks and training do they do? What safer recruitment steps are they using? How are they looking after them over time? The findings will help shape new resources for churches which will be added to the toolkit of <u>JOIN resources</u>. The research is being carried out by Styles and Faal Safeguarding who are an independent safeguarding business. **Get involved** - the survey is for church volunteers, young people under 18, and parents/carers to answer an anonymous survey to

provide information about their experiences and views on the recruitment and training of young leaders in the Church. The survey can be accessed <a href="here">here</a> and the deadline is 31 July.
