Major milestone celebrated in style



A church which was saved after the community rallied to preserve it for their village and future generations has now celebrated its 550th anniversary. Grade I listed St Nicholas' Church, Denston, near Newmarket, was within a hair's breadth of closing in the 1980s until villagers rallied round and saved the building, widely regarded as the finest small late perpendicular church in Suffolk.

Suffolk Churches Ride and Stride / Pedal and Drive 2024



On Saturday traffic on the roads of Suffolk were busier with extra bikes and 116 vintage and classic cars, while towns should have seen an increase in walkers. St Mary's Church in Capel St Mary, south of Ipswich held a full immersion baptism for Sophie and Mia in August. Although people have worshipped at the church for around 900 years there is no record immersion baptism having ever taken place. The Revd Sally Letman welcomed over 200 people into the church for the service congregation – including a large contingent

from other Christian Churches in the area. Sally said "these two amazing young people, have made their choice. They are about to begin the hair-raising adventure, to taste the living bread, to commit their life to Christ and wash away their sins and be born again".
