Elections to Committees

As you are aware, we held elections in November 2024 to a number of committees. There are still some vacancies, detailed below, and so we are currently holding a further round of elections this month.

Thank you to all those who stood and considered standing in supporting us in exercising sound governance across the Diocese. I hope that we can encourage more of you to become involved. If you feel called to work collaboratively, assisting in openness of communication and ensuring clarity of decision making, then please do come forward to offer your time and talents.

Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) election: The Board is particularly concerned with the promotion of education, church schools, RE and Collective Worship. The DBE, through its team of staff, provides a range of support services for schools, supports collaboration between schools, advises on headteacher appointments and admissions, and provides training for governors.

There are **2 vacancies** elected from Diocesan Synod who can be **either clergy or lay** and do not need to be members of Synod themselves.

Diocesan Board of Patronage: Is patron to a number of benefices within the diocese acting either solely or jointly with others. There is **one lay vacancy** on the Board, with a six year term running from 1st January 2025.

Vacancy in See: This committee considers the appointment of the new Diocesan Bishop when a vacancy occurs. The new membership takes up their office from 1 January 2025 for three years, until 31 December 2027. There is **one clergy** elected post, and **two laity** elected posts. Please note that the current Vacancy in See membership remains in place during the current and ongoing process to discern the next Diocesan Bishop after Bishop Martin retires in February 2025.

The deadline for nominations is at midday on **Monday 24 February 2025.**

New Electoral Roll: The Electoral Roll is a list of names and addresses of every person who can vote in the annual parochial church meeting. It is revised annually but replaced in its entirety every six years. The current electoral-rolls (created in 2019) will be replaced with brand-new rolls this year (2025). Everything you need to help you with this is on our website: <u>APCMs and electoral roll - Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich</u>.

In accordance with the <u>Church Representation Rules</u>, following your APCM and no later than 1 July in each year, parishes should give the Diocesan Secretary written notification of the number of names there are on the roll of the parish as at the date of the annual parochial church meeting. To facilitate this requirement, please return your completed Electoral Roll Certificates by email to <u>diocesan.secretary@cofesuffolk.org.</u> We ask that wherever possible forms are returned electronically, however if you have no means to do this, they can be returned by post at the address: Diocesan Electoral Roll Officer, The Diocesan Office, 4 Cutler Street, Ipswich, IP1 1UQ.
