Congratulations to the 20 wonderful people (pictured) confirmed by the Bishop at the Cathedral, coming from benefices across the county - All Hallows' Ipswich, The Sancroft Benefice, St Mary the Virgin Withersfield, St Mary's Haverhill and St George's Lark Valley and North Bury Team, as well as from the cathedral itself.

Last Sunday, Easter Day, St Augustine's in Ipswich were overjoyed to have four people publicly declare their faith through full immersion baptism and re-affirmation of baptismal faith. Libby, Geoff, Louise and Amelia gave their testimonies in front of a church that was full of excitement and joy. Vicar Al Metcalfe said "Baptism is a party, as we celebrate as a family those who have been saved. It is a sign that those baptised have been brought from death to life, and we remember that is true for all of us too"

A Busy Palm Sunday in Great Glemham

Gt Glemham's eventful day started at the village hall to meet two donkeys and local people to process with palm crosses to the church, where over 40 people joined the Benefice Holy Communion service. This was followed by the planning of a new oak tree in the churchyard. In the year of the Coronation the youngest and oldest member of Gt Glemham planted a tree just outside the church and a Sweet Chestnut stands there still. So, as part of Queen's Platinum Jubilee the Parish Council successfully bid for an oak tree offered by East Suffolk Council to plant in the churchyard. The oldest and youngest member of the village, the Earl of Cranbrook (89 years) and Otto Kenworthy (2 years), officially finished the planting. In the afternoon, they welcomed the Close-Brooks family for the Baptism of Arthur (3 years) and Ivy (8 months) Close-Brooks and Rowley Hird (2 years) as the Revd Robin Alderson presided over a happy and joyful occasion ably assisted by many of the children in the congregation. Easter funding boost for St Mary, Stoke by Nayland



A £12,000 National Churches Trust Cornerstone Grant will help fund urgent roof repairs to St Mary, Stoke by Nayland and keep the Grade I Listed church at the heart of the local community. The church also receives a £8,000 Wolfson Fabric Repair Grant from the Wolfson Foundation on the recommendation of the National Churches Trust. Following the collapse of a piece of the outer leaf of the wall of the south aisle in 2020, the

grant will help fund vital repairs and restoration of a considerable length of the parapet above it. It will also help to fund re-slating and re-leading of the chancel roof plus replacement of roof access ladders and rainwater pipes. Andrew Norman-Butler, the senior Churchwarden, said: "The work to be done at St Mary's will be a fascinating exercise in

the restoration of a typical East Anglian rubble-built wall, which incorporates Roman tile in places, and will assure the future of this nationally important church."

News from the Big Weekend



A few weeks ago over 55 young people from 14 different churches came together for a weekend of fun, laughter and a chance to explore their faith with other young Christians. This was led by Matt Levett (Diocesan Youth & Young Adults Officer) and a team of amazing youth leaders and volunteers from various churches. The young people, aged between 10 and 17 years, met at Sizewell Hall – a great Christian conference centre right on the Suffolk coast. The programme included an Escape Room, 30 second crazy games, Nerf gun battles and sessions based around living as a Christian

in the C21st, with lots of free time on the beach making new friends and connections from Churches across the Diocese.
