The Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas 2024, Follow the Star: Calm and Bright, draws on the world-famous carol, Silent Night: "Silent Night! Holy Night! All is calm, all is bright..." Throughout Advent, there will be a focus primarily on how to find **Calm** during this busy period, with reflections offering people a chance to pause during the busy season and tips on how to prepare for a calm

Christmas. Then through Christmas, the focus will be on **Bright**, with a series of daily reflections from Christmas Day to the Eve of Epiphany (5 January) by Sammi Tooze, Discipleship Adviser for the Diocese of York, both in digital form and as a full-colour booklet to share locally. The UN Biodiversity Conference (COP16) is being held in Colombia (21 October - 1 November) and the UN Climate Change conference (COP29), is being held this year in Azerbaijan (30 November to 12 December). How can you get involved? Jo Chamberlain, National Environment Officer at the Church of England, said: "Climate change and big international conferences like this can be hard for any of us to get our heads round. People can also feel slightly helpless and unsure of how they can contribute from home but there are many ways we can all do our bit. As Christians we can pray, and we can share our concerns with our local MP and also raise awareness through our churches. This handy guide offers lots of useful tips on the best ways to ensure your voice is heard at this international climate event."



Give to Go Green: is a national church match-funding campaign to help you double your locally GOGREEN raised donations. Funding is available for churches and church halls/rooms that want to carry out small to

medium-sized projects that will reduce their carbon footprint. Match funding is available up to £10,000, or 50% of your project costs, whichever is lower.

The first phase of Give to Go Green fundraising started on Sunday 1 September and will finish on Sunday 15 December 2024. A number of our churches have taken part already including St Mary's Church in East Bergholt, who are raising funds to reduce the draughts coming from the two main church doors by fixing rails and hanging heavy, fireretardant curtains in the porch and in the West End meeting room. St Peter & St Paul Church in Pettistree is also fundraising (see advert below!) to support their project to create a dry, warm and welcoming space for the use of the whole village.

We are now entering phase two of Give to Go Green, and the application pack and how to apply details for Phase Two will be released on 21 October 2024. The key dates are:

 Applications close: 16 March 2025 • Application assessment: 31 March 2025

• Churches notified: 7 April 2025

• Fundraising period: 17 May - 28 September 2025

A message from Bishop Rhiannon: A huge thank you to the deanery of Ipswich and the whole diocese for your very kind send off, well-wishes and for your very generous gift. The pectoral cross (worn near the heart) was presented to me by the Archbishop of Canterbury at the consecration service at Canterbury Cathedral on the 18 October and I love it! It was designed by the jeweller, Gabriella Lane, and is a 'crux gemmata' (cross of gems) which speaks both of the beauty of the resurrection (represented by the gems) and of the suffering of Christ (represented by the cruciform shape) and how the two always need to be seen together just as the events of Easter Sunday and Good Friday need to be held

together. On the back of the cross is the inscription 'God forgives you' which will be a constant reminder of the power of the cross and God's offer of forgiveness to all.

I have dearly loved my time in Suffolk and will always remember Ipswich in particular with enormous fondness. With love and prayers, Rhiannon

In many of our churches, where the weekly service may be some form of the Eucharist, the Old Testament nowadays is never read. And even where it is, it is often ignored. But it is the larger part of the Bible and has far more to say than the New Testament about things like the life cycle (birth, marriage, death), sickness and health, daily work, the environment, social justice, and so on. In other words, it relates to life as we know it on a day-by-day basis. Of course, there are some challenging bits which need also to be confronted in an honest manner, but they should not deflect us from the riches of what was, after all, Jesus's Bible. (Where did he get the first and great commandment ... and the second is like, namely this...?) In this short course, Hugh Williamson will try to open our eyes to some of this wealth by surveying in an engaging manner all the different types of material in the Old Testament, very much with an eye on how we can apply it in our own times in both church and society. 
