

Mildenhall Recycling Drive



Over the summer St Mary's Church, Mildenhall launched their Recycling challenge. Congregations across the Deanery were asked to pass on unwanted items for recycling at Harvest time.

The team were specifically looking for unwanted/old prescription glasses, sunglasses and mobile phones to be donated to Lions Club International and Phones for Africa, in consideration of the Fourth Mark of Mission: To seek to transform unjust structures of society. Also sought were unwanted/old and even broken cables, old electricals and batteries to be recycled, in consideration of Fifth Mark of Mission: To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the Earth. The church was encouraged to hear that the

challenge had been extended out to local schools and Town Councils. The results were amazing 460 pairs of prescription glasses and sunglasses, over 1,000 batteries, nearly 30kg of cables and more than 50 mobile phones were received.
