After 12 years at St Edmundsbury Cathedral, the Revd Canon Philip Banks will join St Paul's Cathedral as Residentiary Canon and Precentor, with his appointment recently approved by His Majesty The King and confirmed by No. 10 Downing Street. As Precentor, Philip leads the oversight, planning and direction of the Cathedral's daily round of worship and special services, he oversees the music department, the Director of Music

and choirs as well as working with the verger team on maintaining the beautiful ancient and modern building and ensuring it for generations to come.

The Very Revd Joe Hawes, Dean of St Edmundsbury, said: "Philip has not only been a loving, supportive and gentle colleague, he has been an outstanding Precentor for St Edmundsbury. His work has been tireless and exceptional, but more than anything else, I have loved how easily he has laughed with colleagues, prayed faithfully, helped to keep the balance of the Benedictine virtues: stability in his hard work, mutuality of obedience in

his collegiality and the way in which one knows that he is always open to growth and change through the constant conversion of life which must be at the heart of all Christian pilgrimage. He has been a wonderful colleague; St Paul's is fortunate indeed, St Edmundsbury will miss him very much."
