Message from Bishop Martin - Blue Tongue

We are all aware of the rapid rise in blue tongue infections amongst livestock in our region, and the need for more support for farmers and related businesses who face the devastating impact of blue tongue disease amongst livestock.

The disease, which affects cattle, sheep, goats and deer, has now been found in animals in Suffolk, Norfolk and Essex leading to the imposing of severe movement restrictions on livestock covering most of East Anglia.

This disease is deadly for the animals, and the movement restrictions mean farmers cannot take their animals to market. This severely affects the livelihood and well being of farmers and their families, as well as those in businesses that support our agriculture.

I am very grateful to Graham Miles, our agricultural chaplain, for the support he is giving farmers affected by this.

The disease is transmitted by midges and so controlling infection is particularly challenging. We have been anticipating for some time that blue tongue could come to this part of the world since it is has been present in midges the other side of the North Sea and it was only a matter of time before they reached us.

What we need now is much more support for farmers and others who are suffering from the impact both of the disease in their livestock and the consequent restrictions on moving their farm animals. Please pray for our farmers and their families.



Vacancy in See

With Bishop Martin's retirement planned for the end of February 2025, a discernment process is underway to find the next Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. We are grateful for the wide ranging and fruitful participation of the consultations which have taken place across our diocese.

This consultation has enabled a sub-group of the Vacancy in See Committee to shape those many contributions into a Statement of Needs document. The production of this Statement of Needs was underpinned in prayer and the document was considered by the Vacancy in See committee, following several meetings, for a final time on Tuesday 27 August. We are delighted to say that the Statement of Needs was unanimously adopted and we are very grateful for the whole of the Vacancy in See Committee who worked so hard to bring us to this point.

The second key task of the Vacancy in See Committee has been to elect six people from the Committee to represent the Diocese on the Crown Nominations Commission. This is the Commission which shortlists and interviews prospective candidates. It is made up of 14 members - six elected from the Diocese, six General Synod members and both Archbishops. Minor Repairs Grants



The Church of England has a Buildings for Mission initiative and recently provided funds to the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. The funds will focus on small-scale but urgent works and 'stitch in time' projects that could save larger sums in the long-term. The fund

will also be able to help cover the cost of essential improvements for the mission and

ministry of a church. The grants come from the £11 million Buildings for Mission, funded by the Church Commissioners and administered by the Archbishops' Council over the period 2023 to 2025.

Toby Hart, has been appointed as Diocesan Church Buildings Support Officer to administer the fund and the intention is to ensure that the application process is simple and that the grants are awarded quickly. Funds need to be given to parishes by the end of 2025.

We welcome applications from any consecrated church or licenced place of worship in the diocese needing repairs or wishing to make improvements to the building. We can also support expert surveys and reports, or things like scaffolding that enable repairs or improvements. If you have a commissioned role such as Elder or licensed ministry such as Evangelist, Pioneer, Children's & Families' Minister or Youth Minister you can gain authorisation to preach (up to six times a year) for three years.
