An official farewell to Bishop Martin



Bishop Martin retires on Friday 28 February and hundreds of well-wishers attended a farewell service in St Edmundsbury Cathedral on Sunday 2 February to mark his retirement.

Bishop Martin said: "It was most humbling to see such a turn out in the cathedral, a place close to my heart where I have attended many celebrations during my time in Suffolk. The

service brought home the close connections that have been forged during my time as bishop and I leave with a host of treasured memories and friendships that will last the rest of my life. So I thank the people of Suffolk for their welcome in 2015, their support and their passion for the Church in the intervening years, and their warm wishes for my retirement".

A champion of parish and chaplaincy ministry, Bishop Martin had overall responsibility for the Church of England in Suffolk, covering nearly 480 churches and 87 church schools, serving 631,000 people. He has been committed to maintaining and increasing the number of serving clergy in Suffolk, and to not closing churches. In this last year the Diocese has seen a rise in church attendance, particularly among young people. Bishop Martin has adopted a proactive stance in Suffolk with the aim of developing the church's influence in communities at a grassroots level. This led, for example, to practical support for top-up shops and food banks housed on church premises to support families during a cost of living crisis. During his time in Suffolk he also undertook several pilgrimages at Lent with Bishop Mike, the then Bishop of Dunwich. Each time they walked 70 – 80 miles to meet people from all walks of life and understand challenges faced in communities.

Bishop Martin was particularly proud of the diocese's long-established link with Kagera in Tanzania, which he visited in 2019, 2023 and 2024. Bishop Darlington Bendankeha said: "He has shown commitment in making sure that this partnership has moved from one level to another." Bishop Darlington added that Kagera would greatly miss the Bishop "However, his work will continue to speak loudly in our daily lives. He will be remembered as a man of God who worked tirelessly for the church and community within and beyond the UK".

Bishop Martin speaks on his farewell service...

Sunday was overwhelming. First, the Eucharist in the morning with the Cathedral congregation, during which I was very aware it would be the last time I would preside in that wonderful space, with those wonderful people. And then the afternoon Evensong packed with representatives from across the Diocese and County was just so beautiful and, yes, emotional, and far more so than I had anticipated! The music was wonderful, both the fabulous singing and the sumptuous playing. Listening to my children read the lessons felt like rounding off these ten years – they had read at my consecration and enthronement. The farewells were embarrassing and poignant. I just wanted to say in reply, I have been so grateful to God for calling me to this amazing Diocese and allowing me to serve here. And then the laying up of the Diocesan crozier, and the walk with my

family down the aisle as the music to which Jutta and I walked out at our wedding, was moving beyond words. We stepped into the night, and the cold, through the west doors and stood there for a few minutes. I felt in that moment that in my laying up of the crozier, and so symbolically handing over my care for the people of Suffolk, you had given me back to my family.

Gold Eco Award for St Mary's Church, Haughley



St Mary's Church, Haughley, is the fourth church to receive the Gold Eco Church award in Suffolk. The Award is given by A Rocha UK, and reflects commitment to walk in step with nature and put creation care at the heart of what they do.

The Eco Church team has worked over several years to increase the biodiversity of the churchyard and other areas in the village. They also produced local nature

walk maps and are very proud that their Land Management Plan and Plan for Nature has been identified as a nationally leading exemplar by A Rocha UK. The group has ambitious plans to continue churchyard development, for example with a wildflower meadow area and a sensory garden. Churchwarden Josephine Gibson said: "We cannot do enough to protect creation, to adapt our own lifestyles to be as eco-friendly as possible, and to celebrate and conserve biodiversity. We do not see this prestigious award as an end in itself, but instead as a springboard to further effort and development, as part of our church's identity and a critical part of Christian worship, and as part of the wider ecology of the parish." It is revised annually but replaced in its entirety every six years. The current electoral-rolls (created in 2019) will be replaced with brand-new rolls this year (2025). Everything you need to help you with this is on our website: <u>APCMs and electoral roll - Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich</u>.

In accordance with the <u>Church Representation Rules</u>, following your APCM and no later than 1 July in each year, parishes should give the Diocesan Secretary written notification of the number of names there are on the roll of the parish as at the date of the annual parochial church meeting. To facilitate this requirement, please return your completed Electoral Roll Certificates by email to <u>diocesan.secretary@cofesuffolk.org.</u> We ask that wherever possible forms are returned electronically, however if you have no means to do this, they can be returned by post at the address: Diocesan Electoral Roll Officer, The Diocesan Office, 4 Cutler Street, Ipswich, IP1 1UQ.
