### **Inter-faith week**

## £95,350 awarded to Suffolk churches by the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust

Grants totalling over £95,000 were awarded to 17 churches; the successful churches were: St Nicholas, Bedfield; St Mary, Bildeston; Holy Trinity, Blythburgh; St Peter, Brampton; St John, Butley; St Peter, Copdock; St Martin, Fornham St Martin; St Margaret, Herringfleet; All Saints, Holbrook; All Hallows, Ipswich; St Margaret of Antioch, Linstead Parva; St Botolph, North Cove; All Saints, Rede; All Saints, Saxtead; and St Peter, Spexhall.

The work that will be undertaken in the churches includes work on roofs, gutters, windows, WCs and kitchens, but the grants included a number of enabling grants for bigger projects. One was for a payment for archaeological work before building; assessment of a nave wall for movement before embarking on a major project; funding to appoint a fundraiser for a lottery grant and the first phase of a project for restoring wall paintings where they needed a preliminary report to define what had to be done. This will help churches to get the initial work underway, which they find difficult to fund, before applying for major grants for the actual work.

The grant money is raised by the annual Suffolk Churches Ride and Stride Day and the Suffolk Churches vintage and classic car rally, Pedal & Drive. Next year it will be held on Saturday 12 September 2026.

## **Workhouse dedication in St Peter & St Paul Church, Kedington**



The Risbridge Union Workhouse built in 1856, also known as Risbridge Poor Law Institution and Risbridge Hospital, was eventually pulled down. Hundreds of people lived and died there and although all those who died were given a Christian funeral, most were too poor to afford a headstone to mark their grave. Now, thanks to the generosity of local councillors' locality budgets and H.J. Paintin Ltd, Funeral Directors, there is a permanent headstone to remember them. They will also be listed in a book which will be kept in the church so that those who may come looking for the grave of a relative who lived in Risbridge will be able to search for their name and see the

### headstone.

The Revd Christopher Giles dedicated the headstone on 27 September 2025. He said that the story of Risbridge has been revealed to him during his five years here by the people who lived and worked in the village. He is immensely pleased that there is now a headstone to mark the place where hundreds are buried. Chris said this project, which has involved many people, reflects the kindness and community spirit he has experienced in Kedington.

## **Report on the Messy Church Conference 2025**



Pauline Milsted, Licensed Children's and Families' Minister in the Blyth Valley Team, attended the Messy Church Conference in June this year. The theme was 'All Together' and the conference offered a fantastic time of coming together in fellowship, encouraging conversations, excitement, inspiration, fantastic food, new friendships and fun. Pauline said, "There were 14

countries at this international conference where we all came together to share how we are sharing God with children and families through Messy Church (or our children, youth and family work). The enthusiasm and passion that worked its way through all conversations truly re-set the fire inside me. In the Blyth Valley Churches, we do many elements of Messy Church but currently do not run a typical Messy Church. This didn't matter as there was still lots of inspiration, encouragement and ideas shared".

The conference outlined the new Church of England Missional Funded project 'Messy Momentum' which focuses on what happens with our 12 to 16 year olds when they phase out of 'traditional' Messy Church, and/or as a group want something different. Pauline

continued, "It was really inspiring to hear about the pilots that will be launching in Autumn with potential funding for those who already have a Messy Church. We discussed all of the developing ideas in groups, and I was in a group with the amazing Lucy Moore (original founder of Messy Church), trying not to fan girl and concentrate on the task in hand!" **Housing Justice:** The Housing Justice has launched a range of resources for churches looking to address the housing shortage by turning redundant land and buildings into affordable homes for their communities. The Faith in Affordable Housing (FiAH) team has worked closely with churches of all denominations across England and Wales for the duration of the project; providing advice and resources, as well as connecting churches with suitable housing associations, as part of the charity's work towards ensuring that everyone has a home that meets their needs.
