The Well Piece Community Garden



A group of villagers, determined to help their neighbours, has come together as a community to learn about wildlifefriendly gardening techniques and put together 'The Well Piece Community Garden', a project supported by St Mary's Church, Holton St Mary.

The project included the creation of a new path to link the churchyard to the Millennium Green to provide a better,

more interesting route for walkers in the village. It also included raised beds, a wildlife pond, and a behind the scenes fundraiser was initiated with the PCC for an accessible toilet. Within a year, a composting WC was funded and installed, opened by the Revd Manette Crossman, and immediately became a crucial facility for both the church and other village events. None of this would have been possible without the practical support and encouragement of all the PCC, the Parish Council, local organisations and individual villagers. So many have been enthused by the project and came together to help. There is more talking, more sharing and more openness around the village as a result. Read the full story here.

Growing in number at the Stourhead Benefice

The Stourhead Benefice, located near Haverhill in west Suffolk, received £1,500 from the Diocesan Growth Fund grant to provide equipment and support for their parishes to reimagine the use of the church buildings, make their spaces more welcoming and involve their local communities with the ambition to grow younger and grow in number.

The three main areas were: providing updated equipment for the Kedington Church coffee mornings, which is attended by between 30 - 50 people of all ages on a weekly basis; a Benefice garden party which proved to be a big hit when over 70 adults and children, many of whom were not regular attendees at church attended; and finally the Revd Chris Giles led children and their accompanying adults around the Stations of the Cross in the church at Easter. In addition St Mary's Church in Great Bradley started a 'Friends of' group and they have much enthusiasm for reimagining the use of the church space. So far they have raised £1,500 towards the maintenance of the fabric of the building an planting the

seed for repeat visits. The Benefice has continued to build its annual programme of events alongside working with local community groups such as Guides and Scouts and their local Primary School. <u>Read the full story here.</u>
