Over 100 members joined Bishop Martin to begin the new triennium at Diocesan Synod on 2 October. The key focus of the meeting was to shine a light on the many ways churches in Suffolk intentionally engage with their communities. The Revd Carol Mansell, who leads one of the synod focus groups, 'Community Engagement,' and her team presented several videos of current projects and ended with a powerful call to prayer. The stories featured will be included in forthcoming eNews editions.

Synod also approved the 2022 diocesan budget, discussed the Lightwave discernment process, were given a progress report on Living in Love and Faith and heard about resources available to parishes for Generosity Week and for Christmas. Mark Pendlington DL, spoke about the Festival of Suffolk, Suffolk's celebration of the Queen's platinum jubilee in 2022. The relevant Houses elected The Revd Canon Sharon Potter and Tony Allwood to the respective Chairs for the House of Clergy and Chair of the House of Laity.

Faith Empowered

Faith Empowered is a course from Church Army to equip you to lead your local church in mission and evangelism. Gift Aid Awareness Day - Make sure that your church is registered for Gift Aid and is claiming it!

Thursday 7 October

Gift Aid is a valuable way to gain additional income. As PCCs are regarded as charities, they can claim back Gift Aid recovering 25p being every time an eligible individual donates \pounds 1. PCCs using the Give A Little app (online and contactless giving campaigns) have received over \pounds 395k through the Gift Aid schemes over the past two years. The Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme (GASDS) enables reclaim Gift Aid on small cash donations (including contactless donations). Find out more about gift aid <u>here</u>.

Fairtrade Fortnight in Suffolk

Saturday 9 - 17 October

Suffolk Association of Fairtrade Towns aim to increase the knowledge of Fairtrade among children and young people. A highlight will be a live video link to Fairtrade farmer Patrick Kaberia in Kenya on 13 October, in which pupils from three schools across Suffolk will put questions to Patrick live on screen. Other participating schools will form the audience for this and will also be able to ask Patrick questions in an informal session to follow. Activities also include a writing competition and a question-and-answer session with Mike Gidney, the Chief Executive of the Fairtrade Foundation and a Suffolk resident. Felixstowe library and Ipswich Fair Trade shop will have displays explaining what Fairtrade is all about and there will be a Fairtrade stall at the Cathedral's Harvest Festival on 10 October.
