### **Message from Bishop Martin**



"On my visit last month to Kagera, accompanied by seven others including four teenagers, we made a significant step forward, extending our partnership to the two dioceses that were created out of the original Diocese of Kagera.

The relationship between the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich was set up in 1995 with the original diocese which covered the territory between the Rwanda border in the west and Lake

Victoria in the east, with Uganda providing the northern border.

Over time, as their churches grew, that diocese was carved into three, but the relationship with us had not been extended to the two new dioceses, of Lweru and Biharamulo. This year, with the enthusiastic support of our Bishop's Council, we agreed to remedy this. So on this visit we signed an agreement that all four dioceses – us and Kagera, Lweru and Biharamulo – are committed to a partnership of mutual prayer, friendship and sharing of experience and resource.

It was a joyful moment, and what I realised during this visit was what the two newer dioceses were asking for was connection, a relationship, "so we don't feel on our own." That feeling is mutual too. We are enormously enriched by this partnership, not least in learning how to live with very little, and always with gratitude for what we do have. So a real connection, a bond, exists between us, founded on mutual prayer, friendship and sharing. Long may it flourish. There will be more news on this visit, and the links we made with young people as well as with the cathedral in Kagera, after the summer holidays.

This of course was my last visit as bishop. All who visit the Kagera dioceses have learned and received far more than any of us can say. The relationship has shaped the ministry I exercise, my understanding of the wider world, and my faith. For that I thank God. Suffolk churches were selected to take part in 'Give To **Go Green**', a national church match-funding campaign GOGREEN to help double locally raised donations. We are delighted that St Mary's Church in East Bergholt is taking part in the programme as they seek to raise funds

specifically to help save money on heating costs, which last year totalled over £2,000. The plan is to reduce the draughts coming from the two main church doors by fixing rails and hanging heavy, fire-retardant curtains in the porch and in the West End meeting room, which should keep the warm air in and keep the cold air out. The church is organising a series of events in to fundraise for six weeks, and any donations raised during the campaign will be match-funded by the Church of England.

If you have a commissioned role such as Elder or licensed ministry such as Evangelist, Pioneer, Children's & Families' Minister or Youth Minister you
