Suffolk Community Awards

The Suffolk Community Awards 2023 recognises and celebrates all those who have improved the quality of life for a community in Suffolk. It is a partnership approach, delivered by Community Action Suffolk, Suffolk County Council and Suffolk Association of Local Councils.

In total,16 awards are up for grabs, with categories ranging from Most Active Town to Outstanding Contribution to Volunteering, and The Anne Dunford OBE Award for Youth Participation. New this year is a special accolade acknowledging the work of the faith sector which is sponsored by Bishop Martin.

The situation facing refugees, asylum seekers and migrants is a matter of huge global concern and the issues are many and complex. Because refugees are usually extremely vulnerable, they are at risk of being targeted by criminal gangs and drawn into modern slavery and exploitation.

Refugee Week is a UK-wide umbrella festival, and anyone can get involved by holding an event or activity. It aims to celebrate the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary. This year's theme is "compassion" and what compassion looks like in action. As the church is present in every community and at the heart of many, it can lead the way in exemplifying what a compassionate community looks like. Holy Trinity Church, Long Melford exhibition

Preview on Monday 12 June, opening to the public on Monday 19 June

Holy Trinity Church will be covered in scaffolding ready for commencement of repairs to the 38 clerestory windows and east window over the coming months. During this time, the scaffolding will be utilised as a backdrop for mounting a series of displays and exhibits designed to:

- educate visitors about the Bible and Christian faith
- encourage people to take a personal step towards finding or rediscovering their faith
- raise much needed funds for various projects, as the cost of repairs to the clerestory windows alone will be in the region of £150,000!

In addition, two special weekends will be held, the first being 23-25 June and the second 15-17 September, both of which will offer dynamic events for visitors to take part in such as Lego modelling and a treasure hunt. There will also be enactments from the church's long history; bell ringing; organ music; brass rubbing; tower tours (with the possible opportunity to abseil down if you have a head for heights!) plus guided tours of the works to the clerestory windows with live pictures and commentary courtesy of a
