Cathedral Lent Series: 'Fearfully and wonderfully made in the image of God: Challenging perceptions to empower change'

Wednesday evenings in Lent (Wednesday 1 March to 29 March) 7.00pm - 8.00pm On Zoom, everyone welcome

St Edmundsbury Cathedral's Lent series will host a series of speakers looking at the theme 'Fearfully and wonderfully made in the image of God: Challenging perceptions to empower change' The interested line up of speakers are all people who know something about what it means to be part of the Church where misguided perception, unconscious bias or prejudice has undermined their place in the family of God. Our speakers will talk about how perceptions of sexuality, race, disability and social class have called people to question, 'Am I really welcome here?' These will be rich, open and theological discussions about how we can challenge perceptions to empower change.

The series starts on Wednesday 1 March with **The Revd Dr Charlie Bell**, curate of St John the Divine, Kennington and author of Queer Holiness (May 2022). He is also an academic psychiatrist at King's College London and the Maudsley, as well as being the John Marks Fellow, College Lecturer and Director of Studies in Medicine at Girton College, Cambridge.

Dust and Glory:



This Lent we are all invited to explore how we can live well with the mess of everyday life. Dust and Glory encourages us to take a fresh look at the frustrations and failings that every day brings and, rather than pretending we can always avoid them, seek to learn from them and grow closer to God through them. There is a daily Bible reading,

a short reflection and a practical challenge, as well as a prayer linked to the week's theme. Co-written by Bishop Emma Ineson and Abbie Martin, the booklet is designed to be used either in parallel with the Lent Book or independently. An accompanying children's version is also available to help children and their families explore how we can live well together, offering a simple daily activity designed to explore the weekly themes. Diocesan Diary - Gavin Bultitude

As we move ever closer towards Lent, it is important to note that there is still so much happening in the diocese. About two weeks ago I went to an evening event organised by *Together for Ipswich* in St John's Church. It was a fantastic evening with brilliant organisations showing just how much Christians are doing for the people of the town -

God's people are leading the way in providing mental health support, housing the needy, supporting families and reaching out to people in so many ways.

The most inspiring thing for me is that so many churches, both Church of England churches and others, were there. It's easy, especially at the moment, to focus on what divides us and what we disagree on, but here were a range of churches with differing theological positions uniting in service for the town and showing just how the love of God works though them to show this love for other people. The cost-of living crisis is still far from over, and with more cold weather on the way and only very modest reductions in inflation, more and more families are feeling the pressure. Inability to afford heating has a big impact on people's diet, physical health, mental health, and for children, their ability to flourish at school.

I have seen the Top-up shops in Ipswich first-hand and many warm rooms have popped up across the diocese, but we know that not all churches have the scale or resources to do such things and in some cases our churches themselves are struggling to heat themselves. Nonetheless our churches are making a huge difference showing kindness and compassion to those in their communities offering porch pantries, community fridges, supporting food banks, well-being support and signposting to key sources to further help available.

One of the best ways of signposting to further help is through Citizens Advice (CAB). They offer a service without complicated paperwork or referral forms and it's absolutely free. They cover the whole of the county and they have access to specialists for complex or technical issues. I'm really excited about working with them and to spread the message I am hosting two webinars with our local Citizens Advice and I would be delighted if you can join me as we find out more about how we can all help those in need in our communities, combining their knowledge and experience with our Christian love and compassion.

Vocations Spotlight: Evangelists, Helen Prior Townsend says



"I came to faith around 13 years ago when I started going to church after the birth of my daughter. I hadn't been to church apart from things like weddings, baptisms and funerals since I was at primary school, but when I was pregnant I started to think that there was much more to life. I was blessed to meet so many welcoming and friendly people at church and soon I got more involved.

I had felt a calling to do more but I wasn't sure what. Then I saw information about Evangelist training and I couldn't get it out of my head. I completed my Evangelist training during the Covid-19 lockdown in 2020-2021.

Since I have finished my training, I have been able to create our Advent and Lent bags project where we give bags with readings, a short reflection and activity for each week of Lent or Advent to all our congregation, encouraging them to share the bags with friends and family. We take the bags to our toddler group where many of the families who come along don't attend church, we also give them to our school who have used them in their RE lessons.

Being an Evangelist is now really part of who I am. My faith is an integral part of me. I believe that everything I do shines with the light of Christ. I hope I make a difference! I feel that I help build people's confidence in their faith, that they feel confident to tell people that they are a Christian, I ask questions about faith and ask people to serve our church using the gifts that God has given them.
