Music, Mission and Young People project launched



The Music, Mission and Young People (MMYP) project is exploring how churches throughout the Diocese are running, or would like to run, music initiatives for young people, with a faith development pathway. The project is being led by Richard Hubbard (Project Director) and Andrew Gosden (Project Manager). Richard said, "So far we've found 25 churches that are wanting to develop activities, covering a wide range of approaches, including traditional church choirs, after-school music clubs, youth

community choirs and music groups. This is really encouraging".

A key part of the MMYP project is to encourage faith development in young people through music activities. To help support churches with this, a new **Suffolk Music for Growing Faith Network** is being launched with their first meeting to be held on Tuesday 21

January from 12.30pm to 1.30pm, via Zoom. You can register to join the Network here.

Church community raises more than £23,000 through Give to Go Green scheme



The Church of England in Suffolk is taking part in the Give to Go Green campaign, which sees the national CofE match any money raised for eco projects – and is urging more churches across the county to join up.

The community of St Peter and St Paul Church in Pettistree has raised a total of £23,910, including match-funding and gift aid, to revamp and update its parish room, which was built in the churchyard in 1891. The building is being fully insulated and a ramp installed for disabled access.

Churchwarden Martin Corrall said: "The idea is for it to become a useful community resource and bring it into the 21st century. It is sometimes easy to feel powerless in the face of climate change, but our church and its community enthusiastically embraced the recent opportunity of Give to Go Green and its matched funding. The objective, to reduce our carbon footprint and make the parish room a warmer, cheaper to heat space for the

wider use of the community, was simple to understand and very well supported."

For every £1 a church raises during the scheme's window, the Church of England will match it. The scheme is completely digital, run through the online contactless giving platform 'Give a Little'. Read the full story on <u>our website here.</u>

New Electoral Roll: The Electoral Roll is a list of names and addresses of every person who can vote in the annual parochial church meeting. It is revised annually but replaced in its entirety every six years. The current electoral-rolls (created in 2019) will be replaced with brand-new rolls this year (2025). Everything you need to help you with this is on our website: APCMs and electoral roll - Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich

In accordance with the <u>Church Representation Rules (see here)</u>, following your APCM and no later than 1 July in each year, parishes should give the Diocesan Secretary written notification of the number of names there are on the roll of the parish as at the date of the annual parochial church meeting. To facilitate this requirement, please return your completed Electoral Roll Certificates by email to <u>diocesan.secretary@cofesuffolk.org</u>. We ask that wherever possible forms are returned electronically, however if you have no means to do this, they can be returned by post at the address: Diocesan Electoral Roll Officer, The Diocesan Office, 4 Cutler Street, Ipswich, IP1 1UQ.
