It seems to me that every time I have said yes to God he has gently pushed me a little further down my path. I hope I can encourage others along theirs. I never imagined in my youth being where and what I am today. God is full of surprises and full of answers to life's difficulties and mysteries, but, of course, I'm still asking lots of questions as there is always so much more to learn.
