




New Archbishop of Canterbury announced



Downing Street announced last Friday that the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally DBE is to be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. The Rt Revd Dr Joanne Grenfell, the newly appointed Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocese, said: "I am delighted that Bishop Sarah has been appointed Archbishop of Canterbury. Having worked with her for the last six years in the Diocese of

London I have seen first hand her courage, commitment and compassion. I believe that she is the right person to lead the Church of England towards a healthier and safer culture, and to speak about God's justice, peace, and healing in the world. I trust that parishes across the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich will join me in praying for her as she prepares for this new ministry."

This includes for example, if a person attends a funeral you must have their consent to hold their personal details enabling you to contact them in a year's time to invite them to a memorial service. Please do not use the old forms as the direct debit details will be incorrect. If the PGS receive old forms, they will contact the giver directly to enable the correct information to be completed.

- New gifts can be set up from Monday 3 November 2025 when PGS online giving (through www.parishgiving.org.uk/donors/find-your-parish/) and the telephone service call on 0333 002 1271, Monday to Friday, 9.00am – 5.00pm, will once more be available.
- To confirm the revised downtime dates for the PGS website. The PGS website will be taken offline from 3.00pm Monday 13 October, remaining unavailable until Monday 3 November.
